## THE PITCHING WEDGE RULE Doing The Math

When we play golf, we are well served in knowing where our 'Short Tools' hit golf balls.
For example, your '555 Team' wants to know where and how far the 'Full Swing' \#8 Iron, \#9 Iron, \#PW, \#AW, \#SW and the \#LW travels through the air. How far it releases and runs is a completely different consideration. Depends a lot on 'Mother Nature's' conditions and circumstances. The elements matter after touch down ... slope, break, grain, length of the grass, moisture, detritus ... small but important nuances.

Please keep in mind that you are well served by 'Quadranting The Greens'. Cut it into 4 equal areas like a 'Gun Scope'. The cup will be in one of these not necessarily in the center. Now you can plan your 'Touch Down Quadrant' and better manage your 'Putting' outcomes.

Remember we have very little control of our end results until the ball gets on the ground behaving like a putt.

The 'Doing The Math' means that, if we leave ourselves an 'Approach Shot', we should do so to the optimal distance. If your 'Full Swing \#PW' is $115-125$ yards, it would be wise to leave your second strike out about 120 yards. We look at 115 as Soft, 120 as Smooth and 125 as Firm. The easiest and most predictable swing is your 'Smooth Full Swing'.

When you become a proficient 'Body Clocker', 'Distance Controller', you will be a formidable opponent and have lots of weekend match invitations.
